



She co-presents the multi award-winning 'All The Dirt' www.allthedirt.com.au, Australia's most popular gardening podcast with more than 2 million downloads.



Extension Tour to Victoria Falls and Chobe National Park

22 to 28 February 2026



DAY 1 Thursday 20 November, 2025

Auckland, NZ

This afternoon we fly to Auckland, the largest city and commercial centre of New Zealand. On arrival we are transferred to our hotel.

DAY 2 Friday 21 November, 2025

Aucklan

We enjoy a sight-seeing city tour this morning, which takes in the main sights of Auckland, including the Harbour Bridge, which spans the beautiful Waitemata Harbour and the quaint and stylish shopping area of Parnell. In the afternoon we visit Ayrlies Garden and Wetlands, created from 1964 by Beverley and Malcolm McConnell where gardening is an art form. Covering four and a half hectares, it is one of New Zealand's finest and best-known gardens, incorporating three large ponds, cascading waterfalls, a rose garden, rockery, meadow garden and the stimulating "Lurid Border". There's also an adjoining 14ha wetlands reserve. This is a superb seasonal garden to which you will want to return.

DAY 3 Saturday 22 November, 2025

Auckland

This morning we will visit Eden Garden. Once an abandoned quarry on the slopes of Mt Eden, it has been transformed into "the Garden of Eden" A large collection of natives encourage birdlife, there is also collections of rhododendrons, conifers, vireyas underplanted with ferns, hostas and clivias. In the afternoon we visit Highwic homestead and garden. A gothic Revival style homestead build in 1862, which still retains the original Victorian layout of the garden.



DAY 4 Sunday 23 November, 2025

Embarkation

This afternoon we board Noordam, on this fantastic garden cruise circumnavigating New Zealand.

DAY 5 Monday 24 November, 2025

Rotor

We dock in Tauranga and travel to Rotorua to visit two gardens today. The 12ha Tikiteret garden, developed since 1987, incorporates a natural stream, established trees and bog plants including hostas, iris and primulas. Bridges cross the stream, which is lined with a collection of Japanese maples and cherry trees, while azaleas and rhododendrons cover the slopes beyond. We travel on to visit the Garden Art Gallery an award-winning urban garden divided into rooms by trellis's, which allows glimpses into adjoining garden rooms. It is a space to show Jeanette's superb wildlife and plant paintings.

DAY 6 Tuesday 25 November, 2025

Napi

Today we dock at Napier, a coastal city on New Zealand's North Island. It is set amid the renowned wine-producing region of Hawke's Bay. Rebuilt after a 1931 earthquake, the city is known for its numerous art deco landmarks and celebrates its art deco heritage annually with the famous Art Deco Festival. We will enjoy an Art Deco walking tour to see these attractive buildings, before visiting the Art Deco Centre. In the afternoon we will visit Gwavas garden, laid out in the 1880's, the present owner is the fifth generation to have lived on the property. It is one of the largest privately owned collections of temperate wood plants in Australasia. Deryn will make sure that we get the most out of this garden.

DAY 7 Wednesday 26 November, 2025

Picton

Today, after docking in Picton, we visit Welton House, a plant lovers paradise. The garden has been designed to complement the 120-year-old house. We will see unique use of topiary hedges, platforms and pergolas. We continue with a visit to Paripuma, a 20-year-old garden, which has created habitat for wildlife. It incorporates a perennial award-winning garden created in 2020.

DAY 8 Thursday 27 November, 2025

Christchurch

We visit two gardens rated six star by the NZ Garden Trust today. Ohinetahi garden has a formal design with some areas laid out in 1865 by botanist Thomas Potts. A series of perfectly proportioned garden rooms give a strong sense of structure and protect the garden from the sea breezes. In the afternoon we visit Broadfield Estate set on 3.5 ha featuring many natives used in original ways, a kauri forest and beech forest and NZ raised varieties of rhododendron, maples, perennials lilies and roses.

DAY 9 Friday 28 November, 2025

Timaru

Our journey takes us south to Omaru to visit the Public Gardens this morning. When the town was surveyed in 1858, 34 acres were set aside along the Oamaru Creek for the gardens. Today colourful annuals are planted along the creek and an immaculate rose garden takes centre stage.

DAY 10 Saturday 29 November, 2025

Dunedin

Arriving at Port Chambers this morning, we'll be met by our private coach to travel into the city of Dunedin. Originally founded by Scottish settlers and known as the Edinburgh of the South, it features beautifully preserved buildings overlooking parklands. We visit New Zealand's 'castle' which overlooks the Otago Peninsular. Built from 1871, by William Larnach, Larnach Castle showcases beautiful Victorian craftsmanship and antiques . The Barker family bought the 14-hectare property in 1967 and restored the house and garden. The seven acres of gardens include an extensive collection of native plants. We'll continue our day with a visit to the Glenfalloch Woodland Garden, situated in a fertile coastal valley above the harbour. Originally developed by Philip Brady in 1917, it has a collection of superb European trees from 1872, under planted with azaleas and rhododendrons. Fuchsias and native ferns grow luxuriantly beside Russell Creek.

DAY 11 Sunday 30 November, 2025

Fiordland

Nothing can prepare you for the majesty of Milford Sound, star of Fiordlands National Park. New vistas mesmerise at each turn, towering Mitre Peak, rising 1692 metres above the sound, plunging waterfalls, bottlenose and dusky dolphins, fur seals and Fiordland crested penguins are among the wonders in this place of outstanding natural beauty. Sometimes called 'The Sound of Silence', there is a cloistered serenity within Doubtful Sound that contrasts with Milford Sound. At 40 kilometres long and eight across at its widest point, Dusky Sound is one of the largest and most complex fiords in Fiordland. Dusky Sound was discovered and named by Captain Cook in 1773 who originally called it Dusky Bay because of its sombre aspect.



DAY 12 Monday 1 December, 2025

At Sea

The morning will be free to explore the ship. In the afternoon we will have Garden Trivial Pursuit, dividing the group into teams to compete in answering garden questions. There will be prizes for the winners.

DAY 13 Tuesday 2 December 2025

At Sea

We have a free day at sea today to enjoy the many facilities and activities aboard the ship. In the afternoon, Deryn will give a talk on her career in horticulture and the media and answer any questions you might have.

DAY 14 Wednesday 3 December, 2025

Hobart

We will first visit Hannah Moloney's garden. Hannah is a popular presenter on ABC TV's Gardening Australia, regular contributor to ABC Gardening Australia magazine and author of two books. She is also director of Goodlife Permaculture, a business that teaches sustainability, landscape design and community building. Set on a very steep block, Hannah's garden is a living demonstration of the principles of sustainability. We continue with a visit to Crawleighwood Garden. This wonderful two-hectare garden is nestled in the picturesque hills at Nicholls Rivulet near Cygnet in the beautiful Huon Valley. The garden features lush rhododendron woodland and rainforest with myrtles, rare and unusual plants, a wide variety of deciduous trees including maples, meandering paths and a Gondwanan arboretum.

DAY 15 Thursday 4 December, 2025

At Sea

We have a free day at sea today to enjoy the many facilities and activities aboard the ship.

DAY 16 Friday 5 December, 2025

Melbourne

This morning, we arrive in Melbourne and travel to the Dandenong Ranges to visit two exceptional gardens. We first visit Cloudehill where a maze of stone walls and jewel like garden rooms are set within woodlands of historic cool climate trees. In the afternoon, we travel to the Dandenong Ranges Botanic Garden. In 2013, Phillip Johnson and Wes Fleming's Trailfinders 'Australian Garden' exhibit became the first ever Australian entry to win Best Garden at the Royal Horticultural Society's Chelsea Flower Show. This 'Australian Garden' has been re-created on over 7,000 square meters of previously unused space for locals and visitors to enjoy in the Dandenong Ranges.

DAY 17 Saturday 6 December, 2025

At Sea

Our last day and time to buy last minute items or undertake last minute activities. In the afternoon Deryn will host a trivia quiz. This evening we will enjoy farewell drinks to say goodbye to Deryn and group members.

DAY 18 Sunday 7 December, 2025

Sydney

Early risers will get gorgeous views as we sail through Sydney Heads and cruise Sydney Harbour before docking in Sydney. Group members disembark and our wonderful garden cruise is finished.

DAY 1 Wednesday 4 February, 2026

Departure/Singapore

Our holiday begins with a flight to Singapore. On arrival our private coach will transfer us to our hotel.

DAY 2 Thursday 5 February, 2026

ingapo

This morning Deryn will lead us on an exploration of the Gardens by the Bay, situated on one hundred and one hectares of reclaimed land. These wonderful gardens include two cooled conservatories, the Flower Dome and the Cloud Forest which showcase plants from around the world at different latitudes and altitudes. The super tree grove comprises enormous structures built like palm trees, ranging up to 50 meters tall. They are covered by vertical gardens which create shade. The garden aims at minimal environment impact and collects and circulates rainwater. In the afternoon we visit the seventy four hectare Singapore Botanical Garden. The garden was founded in 1859 and is part of an original tropical rainforest of six hectares. The garden's highlight is the stunning National Orchid garden with a collection of more than one thousand species and two thousand hybrid orchids.

DAY 3 Friday 6 February, 2026

Port Louis, Mauritius

Today we fly to the gorgeous island of Mauritius.

DAY 4 Saturday 7 February, 2026 Embarkation, Port Louis

We have a sightseeing tour of the island and the capital, Port Louis, today. The capital still retains aspects of its pirate past. We'll visit the Pamplemousses Botanic Gardens with its spectacular display of giant water lilies and over 500 different plant species. We continue our tour of the island, which will take in the beautiful scenery, and its stunning beaches. Late afternoon we board the Norwegian Dawn.

DAY 5 Sunday 8 February, 2026

Pointe des Galets, Reunion

After docking in Pointe des Galets, we travel to Cirque of Salazie. This rugged and beautiful area, best described as a long, deep canyon, is lined with more than 100 magnificent waterfalls, hills and valleys.



DAY 6 Monday 9 February, 2026

At Sea

A day at sea is the perfect opportunity to explore the fabulous facilities of the ship. Options include a visit to the spa for a relaxing massage. Late morning join us for an interesting talk by Deryn about her life in gardening

DAY 7 Tuesday 10 February, 2026 Antsiranana, Madagascar

Today we visit the vast, beautiful reserve, the Parc National de Montagne d'Ambre. We'll explore the rainforest that blankets an astonishingly biodiverse national park that is home to some of Madagascar's most unusual plants and animals.



DAY 8 Wednesday 11 February, 2026

Nosy Be

This morning we dock in Nosy Bee. Our sightseeing tour takes us to Lokobe Natural Reserve, where we''ll walk through a virginal forest with endemic black lemurs and colourful birds.

DAY 9 Thursday 12 February, 2026

At Sea

A day at sea. Perhaps attend an exercise class, have a swim or visit the library to check out the large collection of books. Late morning join us for gardening trivial pursuit. Deryn will call the questions to test your knowledge of plants and gardens.

DAY 10 Friday 13 February, 2026

At Sea

A day at sea is the perfect opportunity to explore the fabulous facilities of this ship. In the afternoon Deryn will help group members with any problems they have with their plants, suggest alternative plantings or provide ideas (and rudimentary sketch plans) for future garden improvements. Bring photos of your garden and plants to make best use of her skills.

DAY 11 Saturday 14 February, 2026 Richards Bay, South Africa

Today we arrive in Richards Bay, which has the deepest natural harbour in Africa. We will drive north to the DumaZulu Traditional Village, also known as Thundering Zulu, where more than 50 tribal residents form part of a living museum that offers a genuine Zulu cultural experience. DumaZulu is the largest village of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere and the only Zulu community opened up to tourism by King Goodwill Zwelithini.



DAY 12 Sunday 15 February, 2026

Richards Bay

We will enjoy South Africa's sublime natural beauty and wildlife during this superb game drive at the Hluhluwe-Imfolozi Park. Settle in for a picturesque drive north to the park's Memorial Gate. During the two-hour game drive, we will discover that the park is well-known for its small population of rare white rhinos and a spectacular variety of bird and animal life, including elephants, lions, leopards, buffalo, blue wildebeest, zebra, giraffe, cheetahs, mountain reedbuck, kudu and warthogs.

DAY 13 Monday 16 February, 2026

Port Elizabeth

This morning, we dock in Port Elizabeth. We first visit Van Standens Wildflower Reserve, half is comprised of fynbos while the other half is made up of forest and endemic species. We will see many well-known species such as protea, geraniums, agapanthus as well as orchids. We continue with a visit to Settlers Park in the centre of the town.

DAY 14 Tuesday 17 February, 2026

Today we dock in Mossel Bay. We will first visit the Ethno-Botanical Garden and Indigenous Field Garden. It contains a collection of plants that occur naturally in the Mossel Bay area. Our guide will explain how the plants were used for shelter, food, medicinal and spiritual purposes. We continue with a drive along part of the famous Garden Route. We will enjoy the beautiful coastline bordered by extensive lagoons, with indigenous forest and wildflowers.

DAY 15 Wednesday 18 February, 2026

Cape Town

Upon arrival into Cape Town this morning, we will be met by our private coach and depart on a sightseeing tour of the city. Cape Town is a beautiful city surrounded by mountains, vineyards and beaches. The skyline is dominated by the dramatic 1000-metre-high Table Mountain, with sheer cliffs. We will see the Castle of Good Hope, one of the oldest structures in South Africa, the Victoria and Alfred waterfront and the Bo-Kaap area, a colourful mixed-race district. We continue our journey to Elgin to visit Fresh Woods which is a World Federation of Rose Societies Garden of Excellence. The rambling, romantic plantsman's garden has a major collection of heritage roses and many rare trees and shrubs.

Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe and Chobe National Park

DAY 1 Sunday 22 February, 2026

Victoria Falls

This morning we will fly to Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe where we will stay for two nights. On arrival at our hotel the rest of the day is free for you to explore.

DAY 2 Monday 23 February, 2026 Victoria Fa

This morning we enjoy a sightseeing tour of this magnificent sight. Victoria Falls are one of the world's most spectacular waterfalls. The Zambezi River, which is more than 2 km wide at this point, plunges noisily down a series of basalt gorges and raises an iridescent mist that can be seen more than 20 km away. We return to the hotel and the afternoon is free. You can take a helicopter ride over the falls or take a walk with lions. In the late afternoon we'll enjoy a sunset cruise on the Zambezi River. As the sun sets behind the African skyline, you'll have the opportunity to see a variety of game including crocodiles, elephants, birds and hippos.

DAY 3 Tuesday 24 February, 2026

Chobe National Park

Today we travel across the border to Botswana to visit Chobe National Park. The park extends over 11,700 sq kms, encompassing floodplains, swamps, woodland and the Chobe River. The park boasts over 450 species of birds plus Giraffe, Lions, Cape Buffalo, Hippos, Crocodile, Leopard, Impala, Elephants and Zebra, all of which are frequently viewed on safari. After settling into our hotel, we will enjoy a 4 wheel drive safari to search for the 'Big 5' – Lion, Leopard, Elephant, Rhino and Buffalo.

DAY 16 Thursday 19 February, 2026

Disembark/Cape Town

We leave the ship and take the cable car to the summit of Table Mountain to enjoy spectacular views. We continue to Kirstenbosch Botanical Gardens, hailed as one of the world's best botanical gardens. Situated on the eastern slopes of Table Mountain, these gardens were established in and are devoted almost exclusively to preserving indigenous plants and include living collections of South Africa's many and varied species. This afternoon we visit Stellenberg, a historic and beautifully proportioned Cape Dutch homestead surrounded by a graceful garden. Taking inspiration from Hidcote and Sissinghurst in the UK, it features masses of roses, a white garden, and a series of parterres. We check in to our hotel near the Victoria and Alfred enclosed secure shopping area.

DAY 17 Friday 20 February, 2026

Cape Town

Today we travel to the wine region of Stellenbosch. It is a place of great beauty, steeped in South African tradition, which has retained its 18th century charm. Some of South Africa's finest gardens are found here, including Old Nectar, designed from 1941 by Una van der Spuy. Set on a wonderful site in the Jonkershoek Valley with mountains rising high in the background, the steeply sloping site has been formed into a series of terraces. The formal rose garden has views over wide lawn terraces, and the pergolas are wreathed in old roses intertwined with clematis. In the afternoon we will visit Rustenberg Garden reputed to be the best garden in South Africa, we will enjoy the English style garden with a strong focus on heritage roses and perennials. It boasts mature trees and unusual plants, surrounding several spectacular Cape Dutch buildings.

DAY 18 Saturday 21 February, 2026

Cape Town

We journey south to the beautiful peninsula, the Cape of Good Hope. The nature reserve displays a vast range of the Cape's unique Fynbos flora. There are 1,300 Fynbos species in this area, including many proteas. The reserve is also home to baboon, antelope and a variety of bird life. We return to Cape Town via the pretty and historic seaside village of Simon's Town, now a naval base and home to a colony of endangered Jackass penguins. In the evening, we will enjoy a farewell dinner to celebrate our wonderful tour.

DAY 19 Sunday 22 February, 2026

Departure

Today we are transferred to the airport for our flights back to Australia, via Johannesburg.

DAY 20 Monday 23 February, 2026

Australia

Tour members arrive back in Australia and the tour concludes.
